IWG Meeting of the General Rabble. Thursday, March 14, 2013, called to order at 6:30 pm by our intrepid leader, Eric Owens.

John offered the minutes for scrutiny, but they were approved anyway.

Carolyn gave a short report on the show, promising more details after the after show committee meeting, to be held on April fourth. Even though entries were fewer this year, eveyone still deemed the show a sucess and a rousing good time.




Carolyn Greener brought two 4 sided face carving that she and John have done from Gene Fuller's class.
